- Prepare your vehicle check headlights, brake lights, wipers, and coolant levels.

#### Sacramento City Council Approves Pilot Program for Social Cannabis Use

The Sacramento City Council has approved a pilot program allowing social cannabis consumption at designated locations in the city. This initiative aims to assess how such consumption can operate while balancing public health and safety with business growth.

Permitted dispensaries can apply for two types of permits:

- 1.for consuming cannabisinfused food and beverages
- 2.for smoking cannabis products under specific ventilation requirements.

The program will require dispensaries to submit plans for operations and impaired driving prevention. Only those 21 and older will be allowed entry. This pilot follows broader trends in California, where cities like San Francisco and Oakland have implemented similar programs. Additional permits for consumption lounges are expected to become available by mid-2025, following a review of local zoning and land-use policies. 
